LincTel.net Email Accounts will be Disabled on Oct 31st!

Our goal is to keep internet pricing the best value for our customers. In the process of significantly increasing our speeds while keeping the same low price, we decided to reconsider our email offering. In the last year, the email domain lincotel.net has significantly increased in cost and has proven highly unreliable with our third-party host. We feel it is in our customers best interest to migrate from lincotel.net to a different email provider.

October 31st we will be **disabling your lincotel.net account**. We are offering our services to help you set up a new email account at our office and can forward your current lincotel.net email to your new account. This will allow you time to update all your contacts. **Jan 1st, 2023**, lincotel.net email accounts will be **permanently deleted**. As we strive to give you outstanding service at the best price, this change is essential. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause.

****Remember to update any E-bill and online payment accounts, Netflix, Hulu, and other TV subscriptions, Dr and Dentist appointment notifications, and notify your contact list with your new email information. Please save any important emails and contact information you may need. Telemarketers to Honor Do-Not-Call List Registrations Indefinitely

The Federal Communications Commission has amended its rules to require telemarketers to honor registrations with the National Do-Not-Call Registry indefinitely. The previous rules provided that registrations would expire after five years.

This rule change serves to minimize the inconvenience to customers having to reregister their phone numbers every five years and furthers the underlying goal of the Registry to protect consumer privacy rights. You can register your phone number for free, and you may remove your number from the list at any time. Please note, however, that the Do-Not-Call registry does not prevent all unwanted calls. It does not cover the following:

- Calls from organizations with which you have established a business relationship;
- Calls for which you have given prior written permission;
- Calls which are not commercial or do not include unsolicited advertisements;
- Calls by or on behalf of tax-exempt non-profit organizations.

Subscribers may register their residential telephone number, including wireless numbers, on the national Do-Not-Call registry by telephone or by internet at no cost. Consumers can register online for the national Do-Not-Call registry by going to www.donotcall.gov. To register by telephone, consumers may call 1-888-382-1222; for TTY call 1-866-290-4236. You must call from the phone number you wish to register.



STORM WATCH FOR FIBER CUSTOMERS

During a power outage, the battery backup will provide the power needed to allow a customer's corded phone to continue to work for up to 8 hours, depending on the call volume/length. **REMINDER: A CORDLESS PHONE WILL NOT WORK IN THE EVENT OF A POWER OUTAGE!** Once power is restored to the home, the battery will then automatically recharge. If the battery dies before the power is restored or you choose to opt out of a battery backup, you will be unable to make or receive calls until the power is restored. You can purchase or lease an additional battery backup and your internet will stay active in the event of a power outage.
